For ointments, there should be duplicate or triplicate preparations, of the same active content but differing in base, so as to allow an organic fat and a mineral salve to toe used at will, as well as, perhaps, an absorptive ointment containing wool-fat. 5. The physician should never be compelled to consult a pharmacopoeial list to determine whether such and such a preparation of any particular drug be officinal. Every galenical should be officinal for every drug to which it is applicable....
