Images of the French Revolution are conjured by the neighbourhoods of Les Miserables and the mystery of the lost dauphin. Other tours of the very earliest houses and churches along with waterworks, medieval walls, and an underground river - provide a fascinating view into a thousand years of infrastructure. Recommendations are also included for the best ice cream in Paris or the hottest new spot for shopping at Viaduc des Arts.
